SUBJECT: Resources for Hospitals Regarding Upcoming ICE Enforcement Actions

Given the U.S. Dept. of Homeland Security's (DHS) recent announcement of the commencement of "Operation Midway Blitz," an immigration enforcement operation in Chicago as part of the Trump Administration's effort to target "sanctuary cities," this memo provides reminders to hospitals about how to respond to Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) activities.

On Jan. 23, IHA published a member memo explaining DHS' <u>statement</u> entitled "Directives Expanding Law Enforcement and Ending the Abuse of Humanitarian Parole," which rescinded the Biden Administration's guidelines for ICE and Customs and Border Protection (CBP) enforcement actions. The revoked <u>guidelines</u> instructed ICE and CBP to refrain, to the extent possible, from apprehending unauthorized immigrants at or near "sensitive locations" or "protected areas" — such as hospitals and other healthcare facilities, schools, places of worship, shelters, relief centers and at public demonstrations, like rallies and protests. By rescinding this guidance, ICE and CBP now have greater authority to visit these locations and conduct enforcement actions on their premises.

Despite this development, the City of Chicago and Illinois continue to reaffirm their commitment to the <u>Welcoming City Ordinance</u> and the <u>Illinois Trust Act</u>, respectively. In early January the City released <u>guidelines</u> for visits by federal representatives.

However, on Monday, Sept. 8, the U.S. Supreme Court lifted a federal judge's order requiring the Trump Administration to stop ICE arrests without probable cause in Los Angeles. This <u>ruling</u> will let agents proceed with raids, including stopping or detaining people without "reasonable suspicion" that they are in the country illegally, by relying on race or ethnicity, or if they speak Spanish or English with an accent, among other factors.
